Where will we be walking to and what will we see?

This guided walk will celebrate the centenary of the first geological map of Anglesey produced in 1920 by Edward Greenly, ably assisted by his wife Annie. It followed the publication of his book the *Geology of Anglesey*, the previous year in 1919. It takes place in the graveyard where they are buried.

The walk will start in the car park to the church and will last about 1 – 1½ hours. We will look at the diversity of headstones and what they tell us about the geology of the area and the social background. There are paths but some of the walk will take place over grass and the ground is uneven. As this is a graveyard, dogs will not be allowed inside the perimeter walls.

A geodiversity and geoconservation leaflet for the cemetery has also been produced by the GeoMôn UNESCO Global Geopark, with the kind assistance of the University of Chester; the leaflet will be available to those attending.
